Tired of fighting with scared or rowdy pups for nail trims?
Try a scratch board!

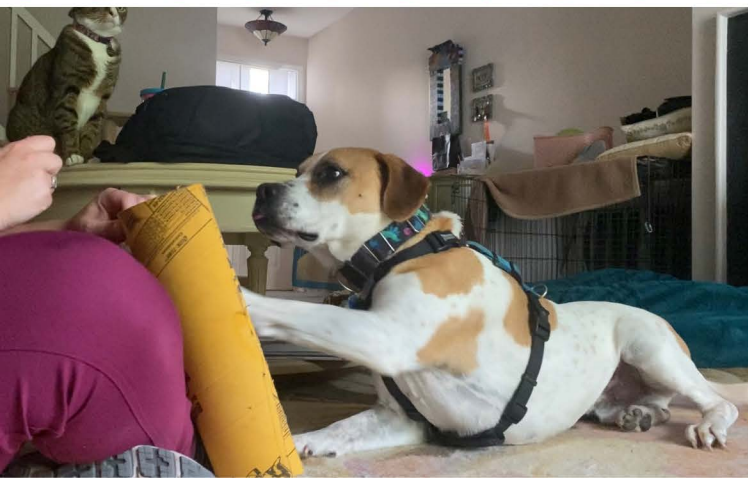
Make your own scratch board

1. Glue 60-80 grit sand paper on an 8x10 flat piece of wood. Start with a finer grit if the dog is small or uncomfortable.
2. Once your dog is trained on a flat board you can advance to a curved surface to reach the side toes better.

Scratch board use in real life!



A scratch board is like a giant nail file for dogs! It's a flat board with sandpaper glued to it. Once you teach a dog how to use it, several brief sessions a week will shorten longer nails. When nails are at a maintenance length you can use the scratch board a couple times a month to keep them maintained.
